Youth Volleyball Rules

3rd - 5th Grade:

- Net height will be 6 ft.
- Serving line is 6 ft. from the back boundary of the court
- These grades use the yellow ball

Serving Rules:

- Player must contact the ball behind the serving line; players may serve from the end line within the sideline extensions
- the serve is illegal if it touches the ceiling. Net serves are legal and always accompany rally scoring
- The serve must land on or within the boundaries of the court (a ball on the line is in)
- The server must wait until the official blows the whistle before serving the ball
- A player has 5 seconds in which to serve the ball
- A side out occurs when the serving team does not successfully return the ball, which turns the serve over to the other team
- Grades 3 - 8: If a player serves 6 points in a row, the serve must rotate (side out)

General Rules:

- A team is allowed a maximum of three (3) hits per side
- A ball that lands within or on any part of the boundary line is in
- A ball that hits or goes over the antenna is automatically out
- A ball can be played off the ceiling if: it stays on the same side of the net and it is not the 3rd hit on a side
- A ball that hits the ceiling and goes over the net is automatically out
- A player may not contact any part of the net with any part of the body at any time, except for head hair
- If a player passes the ball with bent arms, or if the ball hits the player's arms and then his/her chest, the ball will be whistled dead and a double hit will be called by the official. Multiple contacts are legal only when blocking, or on any team's first contact
- Players rotate one position to the right (clockwise) when a side out occurs
- Substitutions should be made from the middle back position
- Rally Scoring: points are awarded even if your team is not serving
- A team wins the game when they score 25 points and have a two point advantage or a two point advantage after 15 minutes.
- Center line violation - player crosses completely over the center line (hand or foot)
- A coin toss will determine first serve. Losing team serves first in the succeeding game
- Serving line violation - player may not go over the line (warning first two games)
- With the exception of the above rules, current M.H.S.A.A. rules govern the play of all games
- The league director will rule on any situation not covered by the rules
- No jewelry
- One time out will be awarded to each team per game

A match will consist of three 15-minute games. The first 10-minutes will be warm-up.
